## Résumé: Grammaire 1

To say *this, that, these, or those*, use the demonstrative adjective **ce**.

MASCULINE	FEMININE	PLURAL
ce pull	cette chemise	ces bottes
cet imperméable		

**Quel** is an interrogative adjective that means *which* or *what*. It has four forms: **quel, quels, quelle, and quelles**.

The forms of **mettre** (*to put/to put on something*) are: je  **mets**, tu  **mets**, il/elle/on  **met**, nous  **mettons**, vous  **mettez**, ils/elles  **mettent**

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## Résumé: Grammaire 2

The **passé composé** has two parts, a helping verb (usually **avoir**) and a past participle. To form the past participle of most *-er* verbs, replace the **-er** with **-é**.

regarder → regardé    j'ai regardé

Some verbs have **irregular past participles**:

être → **été**    avoir → **eu**    vouloir → **voulu**  
boire → **bu**    lire → **lu**    voir → **vu**  
mettre → **mis**    prendre → **pris**    faire → **fait**

Here are some adverbial expressions used to talk about the past: **hier, lundi dernier, la semaine dernière, le mois dernier**.



## Lettres et sons

### The glides [j], [w], and [ɥ]

A glide is a vowel that is pronounced together with, or glided into a neighboring vowel. One glide is [j], which is pronounced much like the y in the English word *yet*. The letter **i** when followed by **e** is pronounced this way: **bien**, **chemisier**. The letters **ll** after **i** are also pronounced this way: **gentille**, **maillot**, **travailler**.

Another glide is [w], which is pronounced much like the w in the English word *wet*. The letter **o** when followed by **i** is pronounced this way: **moi**, **trois**. The letters **ou** when followed by another vowel are also pronounced this way: **Louis**, **jouer**.

The last glide is [ɥ]. This sound is pronounced like [w] but with the tongue kept close to the roof of the mouth. The letter **u** when followed by **i** is pronounced this way: **cuir**, **huit**, **juillet**, **lui**.
