

# French Two Review Packet Spring

Below are examples + explanations for some of the material you learned this year. Anything you learned in class could be on the final exam (either part).

## Passé composé with avoir

To form the **passé composé**, most French verbs use the helping verb **avoir** and the past participle of the main verb. Past participles of all **-er** verbs, most **-ir** verbs and most **-re** verbs are formed as follows:

aider	→	aidé	J'ai aidé ma prof.	<i>I helped my teacher.</i>
choisir	→	choisi	J'ai choisi un croissant.	<i>I chose a croissant.</i>
vendre	→	vendu	J'ai vendu mon vélo.	<i>I sold my bike.</i>

The past participle of the verb does not agree with the subject.

aider					
j'	ai	aidé	nous	avons	aidé
tu	as	aidé	vous	avez	aidé
il/elle/on	a	aidé	ils/elles	ont	aidé

To form a negative sentence in the **passé composé**, put **n'** before the form of **avoir** and **pas** after it.

Il **n'a pas** attendu. *He did not wait.*

To form a question in the **passé composé** using inversion, put the subject pronoun after the form of **avoir**.

**Avez-vous travaillé à** *Did you work at the bakery?*  
la boulangerie?

Say that yesterday everyone did what they like to do. Follow the model.

**A. Modèle:** Saleh et Clément aiment regarder la télé.  
*Hier ils ont regardé la télé.*

1. Adja aime garder les enfants de sa tante.

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2. Damien et moi, nous aimons jouer au basket.

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3. Mes amies aiment téléphoner.

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4. Tu aimes voyager.

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
