

## Direct object pronouns: me, te, nous, vous

In the sentences below, the pronouns in bold are called direct object pronouns. They receive the verb's action and answer the question "who" or "what."

Tu m'**invites**?                      *Are you inviting me?*

Pierre **te** trouve jolie.            *Pierre finds you pretty.*

Le prof **nous** regarde.            *The teacher's looking at us.*

Je **vous** aide?                      *May I help you?*

Note the position of direct object pronouns in sentences that are interrogative, negative or have an infinitive.

**Vous** gâte-t-il?                      *Does he spoil you?*

Non, je ne **te** vois pas.            *No, I don't see you.*

Anne va **me** chercher.            *Anne is going to look for me.*

Here are some other verbs that also take direct object pronouns:

**accompagner** = to accompany

**apporter** = to bring

**entendre** = to hear

**K** Marcel voyage à Paris pour la première fois. Dites qu'il voit chaque chose en utilisant **le, la** ou **les**. Suivez le modèle.

Modèle: le tombeau de Jim Morrison  
*Marcel le voit.*
